Housing Solutions to Close the Racial Wealth Gap

A result of historic exclusion from opportunities to build wealth, Black families' median wealth is just \$28,000 compared to \$188,000 for white families. Considering the fact that homeownership is one of the main mechanisms for acquiring wealth in our economy, there is no question that housing affordability and the racial wealth gap are inextricably linked.

Whether paying a mortgage or paying rent, the ability to afford a stable home is the foundation for American ideals like advancing a career, starting a family, or building a business. Additionally, diversifying the real estate industry, which has historically been underrepresented with less than 1% comprised of black and brown developers, helps to promote efforts in closing the racial wealth gap. This section includes new approaches to breaking down the barriers to homeownership and building wealth, with a particular focus on communities of color.
