Financing high-performance multifamily housing in American communities

What is CPC Climate Capital?

CPC Climate Capital, a subsidiary of <u>The Community Preservation Corporation</u>, leads Climate United's strategy for financing high-performing multifamily housing nationwide. <u>Climate United</u> is a coalition of three nonprofits – CPC Climate Capital, <u>Calvert Impact</u>, and <u>Self-Help Climate Capital</u> – financing historic investments in clean energy projects that support local economic development, American jobs, and small businesses across the country.

Climate United was awarded \$6.97 billion from the National Clean Investment Fund (NCIF), a program under the EPA's Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund. Of this money, CPC Climate Capital received \$2.4 billion to finance high-performance improvements to multifamily housing in communities nationwide.

Climate United and CPC Climate Capital are committed to financing an inclusive and affordable transition towards high-performance housing, with more than 60% of its funds going to low-income, disadvantaged, rural, and Tribal communities nationwide.

What Does CPC Climate Capital Do?

CPC Climate Capital helps multifamily housing owners and developers identify and finance high-performance building improvements, which save energy and support electric grid resiliency.

How do we do this? We provide low-cost debt financing to decrease the overall cost of mortgage capital that owners and developers need to upgrade existing buildings or build high-performance new construction multifamily housing.

We do this while supporting the jobs and industries that build, install, and maintain the infrastructure needed for high-performing multifamily housing. In short, CPC Climate Capital invests in local communities, helping provide homes and jobs for Americans nationwide.

What is Eligible?
